So it was like, okay, and I love all the notes, you know, and and the reason that we chose private, I it's because of my job in the health department because at one point before I came over to sort the St of Rose Response Team, dealing with opioid overdoses in the city, which is at an all time high, I was over on the other side, I call it the University of the Department of Public Health, which is City Clinic, because they deal with all the sexually transmitted infections of the city.

You had my job was there was syphilis and HIV, two reportable infections. You know, when you get syphilis that's a reportable infection because it doesn't just involve the person who has syphilis. It involves their partners as well. Because if you've had sex with someone and they had syphilis and then they've had sex with someone who's had sepsis and then they've had sex with someone, that's that that's what we call an epidemic.

And so within health department parameters, what we do, if we find out that you've been diagnosed with syphilis, we do. We conduct an investigation, which is this private eyes. And what we do is we sit with the person and confidentially, we'll ask them would they like to participate in part in the services? Because we know that when people have sexually transmitted infections, there's a lot of stigma around sexual health and sexually transmitted infections, which there shouldn't be because everybody's having sex.

And if you're having sex with more than one partner, Pop goes the weasel. Sooner or later, baby, something's coming your way especially if you're having condomless encounters, you know, and has no shame with that because most people are having them. They may not say it outright, you and I and most people but if we be on the rates of HIV, the rates of infections wouldn't be high.
